What You Need To Know

How to prepare for your test:

Drink 32 ounces of clear liquids 1 hour prior to your exam. Do not urinate until after the exam.

How long will the test take?

About 1 hour.

What is the purpose of the test?

To show images of the female pelvic organs during pregnancy and to acquire measurements for determining fetal growth and anatomy.

This test is done up to the 15th week of pregnancy. [For a description of the ultrasound test done after the 15th week, see separate sheet called "OB (Pregnancy)."]

How is the test performed?

This test involves two parts: external (abdominal) and internal (vaginal).

For the abdominal evaluation, a doctor or sonographer will place a transducer (a small, handheld probe) on the surface of your lower abdomen. A small amount of gel will be used on the skin to ensure good transducer contact.

For the vaginal evaluation, the transducer will be inserted into your vagina. The tip of the transducer may be circular or oblong but is usually smaller than the standard speculum used to obtain a routine Pap smear. A protective cover will be placed over the transducer, which will then be lubricated to ease insertion and provide better contact with your body. The transducer will be inserted into your vagina by the doctor or sonographer, or you may be asked to insert it yourself in a similar manner as you would a tampon.

The test will not affect your pregnancy.

Required before test:

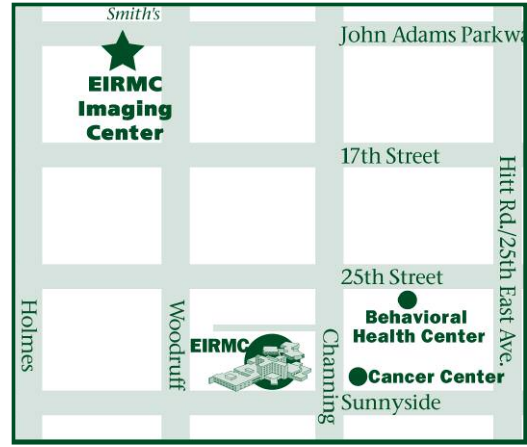
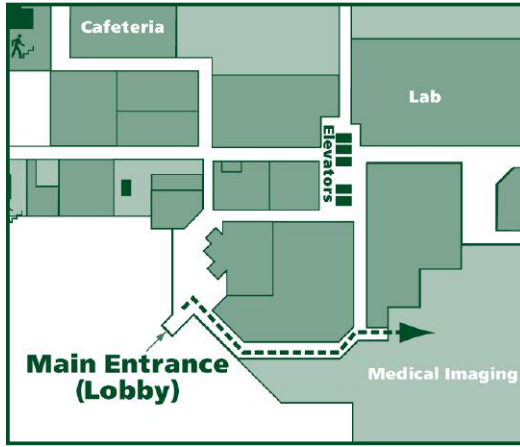
Please provide a signed physician order to perform the exam.
